Now we pray that God protect them and guide them to implement what they have learned and to share what God has done for them through this ministry in their home countries.

Emergency Return

At 3:30pm on March 13 I (George) received a message from a friend in Ukraine alerting me to the fact that the Ukrainian government announced that it was closing its borders to all foreigners from the 15th. It was unclear if this included those of us with residency permits, so the decision was made to change my tickets and return home on the 14th. At 1:55 am with great sorrow, I left the school early to return home to Kyiv. It was the right decision and I am thankful for safe travel. Since then I have been in quarantine at home for 14 days. That ends tomorrow. Thankfully I have had no symptoms of COVID-19.

When Dad's Away...

Abigail is keeping a running list of all the crises that occur whenever Dad's away from home for different ministry trips. I think that this year's trip to Kigali has certainly taken the prize for the most crises. Matthew became very sick shortly after I left on March 1 with bacterial pneumonia and had to be taken to hospital by ambulance on March 3. Thankfully, the hospital care was very good and he was quickly back up on his feet.

Of course, the kids are also counting a worldwide pandemic breaking out while I was away as somehow related to my absence.
